FROM THE DIRECTOR

Aloha Boricua is made up of story, verse, and song – an evocative, sometimes puzzling exploration of history and of the ways in which migrant experience and cultural heritage are distilled, preserved, or turned on their heads. The inspiration for it is double: on one hand, the formidable journey of Puerto Ricans to the islands of Hawai'i at the very tail end of the 19th Century; on the other, the exuberant literature of **Manuel Ramos Otero**, with its queer turns, detours, and multiple voices. From both I draw lessons in difference and fortitude. But what dazzles me most is a shared story-telling habit that sustains and glues together a people over time and space. *Aloha Boricua* is largely made up of those stories –made up, borrowed, or stolen– that make the Puerto Rican diaspora a living thing.

Thank you to all the various people who gave their support and encouragement during the development of this production, in particular the endless inspiration of my husband, scholar and Managing Director of Pregones PRTT **Arnaldo J. 

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Puerto Rican immigration to Hawaii began when the Caribbean's sugar industry was devastated by two hurricanes in 1899. The devastation caused a worldwide shortage in sugar and a huge demand for the product from Hawaii. It was then that plantation owners –dominated by Hawai'i's conservative, fiercely commercial, and politically influential "Big Five" sugar conglomerate– began to recruit jobless but experienced Puerto Rican cane laborers. On 22 November 1900, the first group of Puerto Ricans began their long and unpleasant journey. They set sail from San Juan harbor to New Orleans, then boarded on railroad to Los Angeles, and shipped again across the Pacific. According to the press, the Puerto Ricans were mistreated and starved along the way. They arrived in Hono-lulu on 23 December 1900, and were assigned to work at different plantations throughout the archipelago. By 1901, 5,000 Puerto Rican men, women, and children called Hawai'i their new home. That community has endured and multiplied, and now exceeds 30,000.



MANUEL RAMOS OTERO

Born in Manatí, Puerto Rico, Manuel was a groundbreaking poet, fiction and essay writer, and the first openly gay voice in Puerto Rican literature. A self-identified "sexile," he was a longtime resident

and chronicler of New York City. He wrote exclusively in Spanish and earned a place of distinction in the literary canon only after his death due to complications from AIDS in 1990. His books are *Concierto de metal para un recuerdo y otras orgías de soledad* (1971), *El cuento de la Mujer del Mar* (1979), *La novelabingo* (1976), *El libro de la muerte* (1985), *Página en blanco y staccato* (1987), and *Invitación al polvo* (1991). With no authoritative English-language translations or bilingual editions of his work, Pregones is proud to put his writing within reach and in new bilingual format for a new audience. A previous Pregones Theater production, *El bolero fue mi ruina*, was also adapted from his work in 1997.



was the youngest finalist in the history of the competition. In 2003, he graduated from the MAP/PATH program of the Juilliard school of music. He has recorded on 5 Grammy Award nominated albums and contributed to films, including Lin Manuel Miranda's "*In the Heights*" and "*Vivo*". He is currently part of Eddie Palmieri's Orchestra and has recorded/performed with artists such as Santana, Ricky Martin, Sergio George, La India and Issac Delgado, amongst others.



DESMAR GUEVARA (Composer) is Resident Composer and Musical Director of Pregones/PRTT. He is a recognized champion of new music idioms in Latin jazz, a composer of experimental and non-traditional music for live theater and film, and an in-demand

pianist with numerous concert, touring, and recording credits. He is founding director of chamber jazz ensemble Taller Sicá, founding member of Afro Puerto Rican ensemble Viento de Agua, and has collaborated with many musical luminaries including Tito Puente, Celia Cruz, Tito Nieves, Xiomara Fortuna, Andy Montañez, Soledad Bravo, and Danny Rivera. Premieres: *Grados Inefables*, which delves into the esoteric symbolism and philosophies of Freemasonry, co-commissioned by arts presenters in New York, Colorado, and California.



ROSALBA ROLÓN (Additional Lyrics) is the Artistic Director of PregonesPRTT. She is an accomplished director and dramaturg specializing in the adaptation of literary and non-literary texts for stage performance with live music. Recent productions include

Our mission is to champion a Puerto Rican/Latinx cultural legacy of universal value through creation and performance of original plays and musicals, exchange and partnership with other artists of merit, and engagement of diverse audiences. Our year-round programs offer attractive and affordable opportunities for arts access and participation to NYC residents and visitors alike.

Pregones was founded in 1979 when a group of artists led by Rosalba Rolón set out to create and tour new works in the style of Caribbean and Latin American colectivos or performing ensembles. Established as a South Bronx resident company soon after, Pregones remains in the vanguard of an arts renaissance radiating throughout and beyond The Bronx today.

Spurred by stage and film icon Miriam Colón, PRTT was founded in 1967 as one of the first bilingual theater companies in all the U.S. It is credited for nurturing the development of hundreds of Latinx artists, legitimating creative connections throughout the Spanish-speaking world, and pioneering models for lasting community engagement.

Following merger in 2014, Pregones/PRTT plays a decisive role in empowering diverse artists and audiences to claim their place at the front of the American theater.
